She returned to California to work with a private consulting company, and was assigned to work with public agencies and private companies such as Applied Materials, Sun Microsystems, Genentech, and Chevron.

She is a working manager, and serves as a consultant, trainer, program manager, and safety leader for 30 County departments. She loves working in the field.
